

British Virgin Islands

The British Virgin Islands (BVI) are 60 stunning islands and islets at the northern end of the Lesser Antilles, separating the Atlantic Ocean from the Caribbean. Tortola, Jost Van Dyke, Virgin Gorda and Anegada are the major islands of this enticing archipelago.

Rich in pirate folklore and made famous by the likes of Robert Louis Stevenson's Treasure Island, the BVI offer some of the best sailing to be had anywhere on the planet. Their near-constant trade winds, line of sight navigation, safe anchorages and all-year round high temperatures mean they are a favorite among sailors for good reason.

Set sail from our base at Hodge's Creek Marina, centrally located on Tortola, a short transfer from the local airport. After slipping away from the dock, either bareboat or on one of our by the cabin charters, you will be perfectly positioned in the Sir Francis Drake Channel, the gateway to paradise.

Island hop easy short legs between the smaller islands and explore abundant marine life with your snorkel, coves by kayak or anchor in sheltered spots to watch the blazing sunsets and enjoy night swimming. Visit the RMS Rhone Marine Park and snorkel over a shipwreck or eat ashore to try Caribbean feasts, including the local delicacy, lionfish.

Find peace and quiet at Benures Bay, Key Bay and Lee Bay, swim off the Indians marine park or hop over to the Dog Islands. For nightlife, find the party at Willy T's, Soggy Dollar Bar or Foxy's. Explore the water-filled caves at Baths of Virgin Gorda, leading to the beautiful Devil's Bay Beach, or head to Marina Cay to find the turtles and stingrays. Overnight at Prickly Pear Island or make for Anegada, the only coral island in the BVI with its miles of pink sand.

Whatever your dream, this destination offers tranquil, turquoise waters that lap softly against the hull of your yacht while giant swaths of tropical fish dart just below the surface. Everywhere you look you'll find white-sand beaches fringed with towering palm trees and vibrant beach bars – an experience you won't forget.

Puerto Rico

From dense jungles to extensive beaches, there's something for everyone in beautiful Puerto Rico, the main island in the Greater Antilles. It's a popular winter destination for those looking for warmer climates and the island's friendly people are ready to welcome and share their gorgeous home with you.

Puerto Rico is one of the northernmost islands in the Caribbean and aptly named, as "rico" is Spanish for "rich" and this island is positively overflowing with natural riches. First settled some 4,000 years ago, the island has a rich history too. Part of the United States, Puerto Rican culture is heavily influenced by Spanish, Africans and Native Americans, and locals often refer to themselves as Boricua in honor of their heritage.

On the east coast of Puerto Rico is our base in Puerto del Rey, which is the largest marina in the Caribbean. Here you can enjoy the dockside restaurants and Caribbean atmosphere of the bay. Discover the mountainous interior and National Rainforest El Yunque is worth a trip inland to see its majestic waterfalls and exotic wildlife. Or you can explore the island's capital and the historical district of Old San Juan to admire the architecture and cobblestone streets, all within easy walking distance of the port.

You can island hop between the smaller islands Mona, Desecheo, Caja de Muertos and Culebra with its famous Flamenco Beach. Or sail to Green Beach on Vieques Island, which is the perfect place for a relaxing day for swimming and sunbathing. Only two of these islands are populated, meaning there's plenty of opportunity to find a quiet spot for you and your guests.

To the north of the island, you'll find the Mona Passage with its challenging trade winds and the 25,000ft Puerto Rico Trench, the deepest part of the Atlantic Ocean.

Cuba

With its favorably warm climate, steady winds, unique natural beauty, and open-minded, friendly people, Cuba is a fascinating destination for sailors. When Christopher Columbus discovered the island between the Caribbean Sea and the Atlantic Ocean in 1492, he said, "This is the most beautiful land one has ever seen."

This is the Caribbean's largest island and it's perfect for those who want short-leg island hopping, as it's sited on an archipelago with 4,000 cays and rocky islets. With a spectacular landscape boasting mountains, agricultural valleys with tobacco fields and endless sandy beaches, city life is just as colorful.

Explore the brightly painted colonial architecture in the Cuban cities of Trinidad and Havana, where both cityscapes are UNESCO World Heritage protected. Enjoy Havana's vibrant nightlife and learn to dance the rumba and salsa with the locals, or take a ride around the city in one of the many retro American cars from the 1950s.

There are around 20 marinas and nautical centers all around Cuba that gladly welcome yachts under all flags and offer all the services you'd expect. You'll be able to sail around easily with many stopovers, as the island has a reliable, government-supported nautical infrastructure.

You can find our base in Club Cienfuegos - Punta Gorda, Cienfuegos, one of Cuba's largest and most prosperous cities. It is filled with entertainment venues and eateries, as well as being a hub of activity for shopping and soaking up Cuban culture. From our base, you can explore two main island groups along the southern shore of Cuba and you'll find the whole coast and off-lying islands are fully accessible except for Playa Giron, or the Bay of Pigs, the scene of the ill-fated 1961 invasion to overthrow Fidel Castro.

St. Martin

St. Martin is second only to the British Virgin Islands as our most popular sailing area in the Caribbean. It gives you a taste of the delightful charms of this part of the world, with world-class restaurants, casual beach bars, legendary and sometimes infamous beaches, live music and a fascinating colonial history.

Some 250km north from Continental Guadeloupe, St. Martin belongs to the Northern Archipelago. It's the smallest landmass in the world shared by two independent countries, in this case France and the Netherlands.

The heady mix of the French, Dutch, plus Caribbean influences across cuisine and culture come together here like nowhere else within the island chain. You'll find sophistication and a relaxed, easy-going style woven into the fabric of daily life on the island.

Our base is in Marigot Bay, which has a vibrant town center to discover and is surrounded by beautiful, clear turquoise waters. Sail around to Simpson Bay Lagoon, one of the largest inland lagoons in the region, and watch the super yachts entering, or enjoy a sundowner on the deck at the Sint Maarten Yacht Club.

Head to Grand-Case, a protected cove west of St. Martin, and admire its colorful houses or sample local Creole food. Explore Tintamarre at the heart of the nature reserve before sailing to Pinel Island. The volcanic island of St Barth is nearby too.

St. Martin has a wonderful mix of island hopping and open water sailing to keep every sailor happy.

Antigua

Head to Antigua to navigate the same waters as Horatio Nelson, sail with a steady wind and snorkel with tropical fish among coral reefs and jade waters. This is the largest of the English-speaking Leeward Islands in the Eastern Caribbean with a winding coastline, which hides powdery beaches.


Nelson made Antigua the Royal Navy's most important Caribbean base in 1784 and now, more than 200 years later, the same characteristics have attracted us to this island paradise. Our base is in the iconic English Harbor, a full-service marina with restaurants, a supermarket, boutique shopping and a welcoming atmosphere. In the spring, more than 100 yachts, from performance racers to cruisers, head here for Antigua Sailing Week.

To the south is the island of Montserrat and to the north and west are Nevis, St. Kitts, St. Barts and St. Martin. Sailors flock here to relax in the warm climate, which is cooled by steady trade winds. Visitors are spoiled for choice when it comes to sunbathing and swimming, as there is said to be 365 distinct beaches on Antigua, one for every day of the year.

Sail to Barbuda for its 17-mile pink sand beach and experience the soft, ground coral beneath your feet. With a beach this long, you won't have any trouble finding somewhere to relax in total isolation.

Ashore, in Antigua's capital of St. John's, you'll find the baroque towers of the cathedral, which dominate the skyline, and a lively hub for shopping and dining. English Harbor has undergone transformation and now the restored Nelson's Dockyard is the last working Georgian-era dockyard in the world. Take in the view from Shirley Heights and enjoy the famous Sunday night party, complete with steel band and rum punch. No trip to Antigua is complete without it.



Guadeloupe

Guadeloupe is a French archipelago in the Caribbean with a distinctive butterfly shape and part of the Leeward Islands.

Popular with visitors, Pointe-à-Pitre, on the island of Grande-Terre, is the island's biggest city and in the southeast corner. The western island wing is Basse-Terre, which is dominated by a national park. A narrow channel called the Salt River separates the two halves of the island.

Ashore, you can discover rolling fields of sugarcane and lush tropical rainforests, home to many rare and colorful species of birds and animals. For the water babies, snorkelers and divers will be captivated by the diversity of marine and coral life in the clean, azure waters. Foodies will delight in the delicious and distinctive cuisine, which is a blend of French and Creole influences.

Make sure you don't miss the beautiful Crayfish Waterfall, where you can linger for a swim in the refreshing pools. For a dramatic sight, head to the south of Basse-Terre and visit the 350ft Carbet Falls. From our base at Pointe-à-Pitre, head south and hop between untouched islands with rich vegetation or head north for more challenging blue-water cruising.

Marie Galante offers fantastic snorkeling but watch out for the buoys and lobster pots placed by local fishermen. The Gosier islet and its large coral reef are worth an underwater explore too. For anchorages, head to Les Saintes and take a stroll around Fort Napoleon on Terre-de-Haut.

Visit Jacques Cousteau's Underwater Reserve in the waters close to Pigeon Island for an abundance of colorful coral forests and marine life. This underwater world is considered one of the best dive sites you can experience.





The Bahamas

The Bahamas is a true sailor's paradise with shallow, easy-to-sail turquoise waters and a warm climate. The Abaco Island chain forms a boomerang shape of outer cays and islands over 130 miles, which create naturally protected waters often called the Sea of Abaco. Nature lovers can spot around 200 species of birds, including the Green Bahamian Parrot, among the islands.

This group of islands, part of the Out Islands, includes the mainland of Great Abaco and Little Abaco, together with smaller barrier cays of which most are uninhabited.

Our base is on Great Abaco Island at Marsh Harbour and serves as our gateway to the stellar sailing grounds, where summer temperatures average 26.5°C/80°F to 29.4°C/85°F.

You'll find pastel painted colonial architecture on Elbow Cay and Green Turtle Cay, where the British loyalists made new homes following the American Revolution. To see fine examples, visit Toad Hall and Butterfly House. At Hope Town, you can see the 'candy stripe' lighthouse which marks the Elbow Cay Reef.

Most sailors are attracted to the Bahamas for its glorious beaches. For those who want to sunbathe and snorkel, enjoy the seven-mile long Great Guana Cay beach. Great Guana is the home of the world-famous Nippers Bar with its equally renowned Sunday hog roast.

Treasure Cay beach is one of the top 10 beaches in the world, where you'll find a secluded spot to relax with swaying palms providing dappled shade. Set sail for Man of War, a sleepy, but prosperous and beautifully maintained settlement where good snorkeling can be found on the ocean side of the island. Also, stop by Green Turtle Cay, with its deep bays, sounds and delightful beaches at Gillam Bay and Coco Bay.



La Paz, Mexico

La Paz sits at the end of Mexico's Baja California Sur peninsula and means "peace" in Spanish, which is the perfect description of this laidback city. If you want the chance to see magnificent sea life and an exciting coastline with great beaches, then this is perfect place to plan your yacht charter.

Sail to Isla San Francisco, a popular anchorage in a crescent-shaped bay for sublime hiking, snorkeling, fishing and beaches. Make for Puerto Balandra with its eight unspoilt white sand beaches and inland salt lagoon with the "El Hongo" rock formation, also known as the mushroom. Cruise around Puerto Ballena, stopping at Ballena Island, Gallo Island, and Gallina Island, which all sit in well-protected turquoise waters.

French oceanographer Jacques Cousteau described the waters in this region of the Gulf of California, as "the aquarium of the world" because of the wide variety of underwater marine life found in the calm bays and beautiful waters surrounding the unspoiled offshore islands.

Greece

Greece is probably the cradle of Western Civilization, renowned for its politics, philosophy, history, the arts, medicine, trade and sportsmanship. Greece, the land of sumptuous olive groves, ancient civilizations and laid back beach life, is made up of thousands of islands grouped into families with their individual traditions, culture, and landscape. Our bases are spread throughout the islands in the Aegean and Ionian seas, giving sailors the perfect island hopping yacht charter.

ATHENS

Our base in the Alimos Marina in the Greek capital is an ideal spot to begin sailing in the region. Along with magnificent beaches, you can visit two UNESCO World Heritage sites, the Acropolis, with the Parthenon, and the Daphni Monastery.

Create an exciting itinerary from our base that explores the Saronic Islands, an archipelago in the Saronic Gulf. Hop between Aegina, Salamis, Poros and the nearby islands of Hydra, with its natural springs, and Spetses with its secluded coves.

LAVRION

Our base offers you the chance to discover the Saronic Islands and the Cyclades, where you can find the blue-domed and whitewashed Santorini and the quieter Ios, Serifos, Anafi and Tinos to name a few.

IONIAN ISLANDS

Seven major and 30 minor islands make up the Ionian chain. We have two bases here in Gouvia Marina, Corfu, and Lefkas Marina, Lefkas. From both locations, it's an easy day sail to the other Ionian Islands, including Paxos, Ithaca, Zante and Kefalonia.

Stroll Corfu's old town, a UNESCO World Heritage site, with its old citadel, Palaio Frourio and Achilleion Palace and gardens. For relaxation and water sports, head to Gouvia's beaches or dine in the local bistros to try some of the famous regional dishes, such as Sofrito or Kreatopita pie. On Lefkas, the beach at Vassiliki is a haven for windsurfing. You'll find dramatic and photogenic high cliffs behind the west coast beaches, such as Porto Katsiki and Egremni. If you crave quiet and solitude, then Nidri beach will suit nicely.





THE SPORADES

You can explore four major and 24 minor islands from our base on Skiathos, a forested island with castles and home of the Mediterranean Monk seal. The islands are characterized by their rocky landscapes, dense vegetation and pure blue seas. Enjoy the beach at Koukounaries, or for the daring, the famous nudist spot at Little Banana beach.

THE CYCLADES

This group of 220 islands is the most famous cluster in Greece, known for their archaeological importance. They sit southeast of the mainland and make up the Cyclades, where you'll find clear blue waters, mountainous scenery and friendly people.

Our base at Paros is located in Paroikia bay, which is known for its shipbuilding, silk trading and early copper work. You can sail to Santorini and visit its volcanic caldera, the location of the legendary city of Atlantis, while on Mykonos you can enjoy vibrant nightlife.

DODECANESE ISLANDS

Located between the Cyclades and the coast of Turkey, we have bases in both Rhodes and Kos where the villages have a different style and vibe than the Cyclades. Kos was the location of Hippocrates' medical school and the largest marketplace in the ancient world. Near our Rhodes base in Mandraki Port, you can see a pair of modern bronze deer that mark where the great Colossus is thought to have stood.

Croatia

More than 1,200 islands dot the Adriatic Sea off the coast of Croatia, easily making it one of the most delightful sailing locations in Europe. Known as the Republic of Croatia today, it was part of the Austro-Hungarian Empire until the end of World War I, when it became part of Yugoslavia until 1991.

You'll find westerly Mistral winds, hospitable towns, clean ports and lively fishing communities in this multicultural region. Our bases are centrally located along the Adriatic in the cities of Dubrovnik, Trogir and Zaton, near Šibenik. Discover ancient walled cities and cobbled streets lined with terracotta roofed buildings.

Šibenik is the perfect starting point for your charter, where you can explore St Anne's Fortress, the city's landmark. Nearby you can find some of Croatia's finest beaches at Primošten, such as the shallow pebble beach at Raduča which often features in the country's top 10 beaches.

On the water, you can sail up river and anchor a short walk from the impressive seven waterfalls at Krka National Park. You can also head to the Kornati National Park with its 140 uninhabited islands. It's considered a "nautical paradise" with many reefs and inlets to explore amid calm waters.

The medieval walled city at Trogir features architecture from the 13th century, and don't miss the 3rd century bas-relief of Kairos within the Benedictine Monastery of St Nicholas. Zadar in the northern part of Dalmatia, is a region of historical importance with its character showing Roman and Venetian influences. Nearby mountainous Ugljan Island, on Zadar's archipelago, offers quiet swimming coves to relax in and fantastic hiking trails.

Split is known for its olives and aromatic plants and is a historically important city. The Roman emperor Diocletian built a home there, attracted to the islands of Split's archipelago, which are protected by the sea on one side and by high mountains on the other.

Dubrovnik, in Dalmatia's southernmost region, is an ancient walled city often known as the "Pearl of the Adriatic".





You can walk along the city walls with sheer drops flanked by the Adriatic or enjoy the beautifully landscaped renaissance parks, flower gardens and medieval stone palaces. The city's climate is typically Mediterranean with hot, dry summers, perfect for the plentiful groves of lemon, orange and tangerine trees beside palms and agaves.

Historically, the city's economy has been based on maritime trade. Today, tourism plays an important role in its success and it's long been known as a place to be seen. Dubrovnik's popularity has increased since the hit TV series Game of Thrones, which filmed famous scenes here.

English writer George Bernard Shaw once said, "Those who seek paradise on Earth should come to Dubrovnik and find it."



NEW Pula, Croatia

We're excited to introduce our newest Croatian base at Pula on the Istrian peninsula, known for its diverse festivals and concerts. It's a fantastic gateway to hop between islands in the Kvarner Gulf, such as Krk, which is the largest island in the Adriatic.

Ashore you can walk around Pula's fascinating Roman structures, including the Pula Arena. This Roman amphitheater is the country's best preserved ancient building. Another feat of Roman architecture worth a visit is the Temple of Augustus, where you can see Roman sculpture.

Pula is also a busy commercial city with flourishing resorts and beaches that also have a small-town atmosphere. Much like the rest of Croatia, Pula has a large wine and fishing industry due to its proximity to the coast. For nature lovers, head to Pula's beautiful national parks and nature stops.

Make for the Brijuni Islands and the Brijuni National Park, a densely wooded area that has some safari animals. Continue your adventure by sailing to Cres and Lošinj in the south where Greek myths echo among the islands' villages of today. This is where it is believed Jason and the Argonauts took the golden fleece. Set sail for Rab to find secluded coves on the Kvarner Gulf's most beautiful isle, or head to Pag to try the famous cheese at Kolan.

For the foodies, you'll find some of the best Italian restaurants in Croatia and yet this isn't your average Italian cuisine. Italian food in Croatia is heavily influenced by the region and has a Croatian twist, so try tasty seafood and white truffles. If you want to try local beverages, grape growing in Croatia runs in the blood of locals due to the area's soil and climate. The country is famous for its merlots and cabernet sauvignons.

This new country declared independence in 2006 although its origins go back to the Iron Age with the Illyrians, its first settlers.


Just south of Croatia, Montenegro is slowly drawing sailing enthusiasts from all over the world. It has much to offer with miles of sandy beaches, uninhabited islands and plenty of secret coves and charming harbors, alongside unique historical sites that remind us of the country's grand past.

Our new base is in the Bay of Kotor. This is southern Europe's longest fjord, which is lined with forests and dwarfed by hulking mountain ranges that drop dramatically into the bay.

The sailing conditions in this region are fantastic for all levels of charter experience with typical Mediterranean moderate winds and warm climate. As you charter along the coast you'll see terracotta topped villages and towns with Byzantine churches reflecting in the special blue-green of the clear Adriatic.

It's a relaxed pace of life here and you can take your time exploring the Herceg Novi's 14th century old town, the blue grotto with its bats hanging from the ceiling or Dobrec's pebble beach, which is only accessible by boat. At Budva enjoy a party atmosphere at Ploce beach or go for an early morning swim at Mogren beach to avoid the crowds.

Any itinerary needs to include the UNESCO World Heritage sites of Perast and Kotor. Climb the steps to the top of the impressive Venetian Kotor Fortress at Kotor. Be prepared for a steep hike, but the view back across the town and the bay is well worth the effort.

Balearic Islands

Among the most beautiful in the western Mediterranean Sea, the archipelago of the Balearic Islands lies off the eastern coast of the Iberian Peninsula and is an autonomous province of Spain. The islands' origins stretch back to ancient civilizations of Greece and Phoenicia.

Majorca, Minorca and the small island of Cabrera make up what is known as the Gymnesian Islands, while Ibiza and Formentera form the Pityusic Islands, an ancient reference to pine trees. You'll get a warm welcome from the friendly locals, most of whom speak Spanish as well as their native Catalan.

This part of the world offers nearly 300 days of sun each year, more than 350 beautiful beaches for sunbathing and warm waters to swim in. Strategically situated between the European mainland and Africa, these islands were invaded by the Moors and many cultures over the centuries, with traces of human habitation going back nearly 8,000 years.

Be sure to include cave exploration on your itinerary, especially the Dragon Caves on Majorca with their sensational stalagmites, stalactites and an underground lake. For whales, dolphins and seabirds, head to the Cabrera Archipelago Maritime-Terrestrial National Park with its 19 small islands and islets south of Majorca. On Minorca you'll find treasured archaeological sites with megalithic structures called talaiots and taules.

For wine lovers, there are at least 13 wineries on the Balearic Islands and wine has been produced here since Roman times. So, whether you want to relax in the sun, get up close to marine life, go clubbing or winery hopping, the Balearic Islands offer great variety.

Check out Salvador Dali's home, House Portlligat at Cadaqués, which he used as a studio and is now a museum filled with amazing artwork.

The traditional fishing town of Tossa de Mar is worth a stop by with its medieval history and fortifications, such as the Tossa de Mar Castle and the Moorish Tower built in the 16th century. If you are a fan of ancient history, head to the Greek and Roman ruins of Empuries between L'Escala and Sant Marti. You can stroll among the remains of walls, temples and mosaics, which were first excavated in 1908.

For those who like to sample the local dishes, you'll find Greek-influenced delights here with traditional fish stew, seafood and squid ink-infused rice. To accompany your gastronomic finds, make sure you try the Spanish sparkling cava or sangria.

With warm climates, sunny beaches and the exquisite artwork of famous artists, Spain is the perfect destination for your yacht charter.

Our base is in St. Mandrier-sur-Mer, Port Pin Rolland, on the western end of France's Blue Coast. Here you can marvel at the sophisticated jet set and sail along some of the earliest western trades routes.

CORSICA

The island is a place of natural beauty with 40 varieties of orchid and endangered animals thriving in the alpine mountains. Sicily

Sicily is the largest island in Italy and located right at the tip of Italy's "toe", which is separated by the Strait of Messina. The island offers visitors plenty of history and beautiful mountains and hills to climb. It's also the gateway to the Aeolian Islands, a UNESCO heritage site.

Get away from it all on the remote islands of Filicudi, with its Grotta del Bue Marino, and Alicudi, with its steep summit, which is worth a climb.

Our new base at Marina di Portorosa, offers you the perfect place to explore the Aeolians. You can also explore the mainland and Europe's largest active volcano, Etna, on the eastern coast of Sicily. Or you can visit the archaeological ruins of Agrigento, built in the early 14th century, or the Greek temples, in what is left of the city of Akragas.

Around Sicily's coast you can explore the Zingaro Nature Reserve's pebbly coves and its 7km of coastal walks. If you want to get close to marine life, stop by Torre Salsa, where loggerhead sea turtles breed and you might even catch a glimpse of a peregrine falcon.

Italy is famous for its food worldwide, and before you set sail, try pasta alla norma. This is Sicily's signature and historic pasta dish featuring eggplant, tomatoes, ricotta cheese, and basil.

Sardinia

NEW Naples

The largest city in southern Italy, Naples is in the Campania region and famous for its UNESCO World Heritage status. If you want to venture ashore, you can get a close view of Mount Vesuvius, which towers above Naples and is mainland Europe's only active volcano. Or, visit Pompeii to see the Vesuvius National Park and stand on ground that was once destroyed by the disastrous eruption of AD 79.

Naples is the birthplace of pizza and the Margherita, with its ingredients of mozzarella, tomato and basil making up the colors of the Italian flag. For authentic pizza try Palazzo Petrucci, located right on the shore in Naples, or stop by Antica Pizzeria Port'Alba, which was the world's first pizzeria to open in 1830.

To the west, you'll find Buckler's Hard and its rich naval history on the Beaulieu River, or you can visit the National Motor Museum at Beaulieu and sail onwards to Poole and Weymouth.



Brittany

Find us at La Trinité-sur-Mer, which is the perfect base to discover the dramatic Côte Sauvage, or the Wild Coast, with its islands, inlets and sandy beaches with a pink granite mountainous backdrop.

Brittany's long, rugged coastline is surprising as some of the region's sandy beaches and bays are more akin to what you'd find in the Caribbean with its sun-kissed azure waters.

Anchorage are varied and scenic and you can choose from rivers and ports to nearby islands. Surfers flock to La Plage de Donnant, whereas you can find shallow calm waters at Plage d'Herlin and Plage de Baluden or 2km of gold and white sand at La Plage des Grands Sables. Gavrinis, a small, uninhabited island, hosts what may arguably be Brittany's most impressive Neolithic site with a pyramid-shaped stone burial chamber featuring a long stone passageway with beautiful, ancient carvings and artwork.

Brittany's 14km peninsula offers all kinds of water sports and activities, such as sea kayaking, surfing, diving, golfing, cycling and hikes along the beautiful coastal path should you want even more excitement away from the helm. For something a little different, try char à voile or sand yachting at Quiberon.

Our Gallic neighbors boast incredible cuisine and traditional Breton specialties include sweet and savory crêpes, local ciders and giant, colorful fruits de mer seafood platters that look as good as they taste. A speciality is the Belon native oysters grown in the mouth of the river Belon.

Seychelles

The Seychelles has earned its description as a true paradise with its huge granite rocks polished by Indian Ocean waves, giant palm trees with their famous “coco de mer” double coconut, inlets with azure waters and lush, green takamakas shading fine, white sand beaches.

The Seychelles is an archipelago made up of 115 islands in two rings. There are the inland islands that host most of the population, particularly on Praslin and La Digue and the Outer Islands, formed from low-lying coral atolls and reef islands that are more remote and less visited.


The main island of Mahé, with its capital Victoria, is within the Granitic Seychelles. This chain of 45 islands are the world’s oldest granite islands. The other island groups, Amirante, Faraquhar and Aldabra, are coral. We have bases in Mahé, the southernmost main island, and Praslin - both are fantastic for sailing between the Inner Islands.

Visit Cousin Island, just off Praslin, a nature reserve and bird sanctuary with rare species and giant turtles. The island is not even half of a mile in diameter but has a photogenic panoramic view where you can capture tropical birds flying by.

For more wildlife, sail to Curieuse and stop in Anse san José to explore the Marine National Park Curieuse. Head inland for a 45-minute walk and you’ll be through to the other side of the island, which is home to 100 or so giant turtles. You cannot miss them.

With its coral and tropical marine life, the Seychelles is also home to some of the best snorkeling spots in the world and has become a hotspot for divers. Sail to Thérèse Island through Baie Ternay for some of the region’s best snorkeling and to spot rays and turtles.

OUR GUARANTEE

Base managers are responsible for giving you an overview of your cruising area, inspecting the yacht for safety, and familiarising you with all aspects of your yacht, above and below the waterline. Before you leave the base, you will become familiar with:

- All of the safety equipment including: fire extinguishers, lifejackets, and first aid kit(s)
- Cooking and refrigeration systems
- The heads and showers
- Engine and regular check procedures
- The VHF radio system and proper mayday instructions
- All instruments, including the GPS
- All necessary charts and pilot books
- The halyards, winches, reefing lines and other rigging and controls
- The anchoring system(s)
- Dinghy and its engine
- All other systems particular to that vessel

Our base managers and staff want to make sure that you are comfortable with handling the boat. If you are not, they can arrange for the addition of a skipper (at a nominal fee) to assist you on a daily basis until you feel confident that you can manage the boat on your own.

All of our yachts meet the highest safety requirements, are very well maintained and undergo regular technical checks. Should a technical failure happen despite our highly professional maintenance, we commit ourselves to repairing the failure within 4 hours following your call to the base during working hours (8 am to 5 pm). If you lose more than 4 hours (during working hours) we will refund you one full day. If the repair takes more than 1 day, we will provide you with a similar boat or refund you on a pro rata basis. In case of emergency, you can rely on our hotline, at any time, 7 days a week.

WHAT IS INCLUDED IN THE CHARTER

All our yachts are delivered to you with full fuel tanks (yacht and dinghy), a full tank of water, one bottle of cooking gas in duty plus one spare bottle. You have to return the yacht with full tanks of fuel and water.

WHAT IS INCLUDED IN THE RATES

First and last night at the Dream Yacht Charter base - autopilot; GPS; CD player and cockpit speakers; dinghy and outboard engine; two sets of linens*, towels and beach towels* per person per week; snorkelling gear; and the Dream Yacht Charter guarantees.

The rates do not include the following:

- Cancellation insurance
- Airport-base-airport transfers
- Diesel, fuel and water (except as noted above) *UK charters do not include linen or beach towels.

ADDITIONAL COSTS

Taxes and cruising fees, a cleaning fee, a starter pack (which includes one bottle of locally sourced alcoholic beverage, four 1.5 L bottles of water, one small bottle of dish washing liquid, one dish cloth and one sponge, bin bags, one roll of paper towels, one box of matches, one roll of toilet paper in each head), and the Damage Waiver fee.

DAMAGE WAIVER DEPOSIT

To be paid at the base upon embarkation by bank certified cheque, cash, travellers cheques, or credit card (Visa or Master Card). If paid by credit card, the client should contact his/her bank to let it know about the transaction. Should the refundable full security deposit paid by credit card be refused at the time of embarkation, the client will be obliged to subscribe to the non-refundable security insurance. A Damage Waiver fee is available to reduce your liability and lower your Damage Waiver Deposit.

HOW TO BOOK

To make a booking you can contact us in several ways; directly over the telephone, via our website, or drop us an email.

The person making the booking (the 'lead name') must be 18 years old or over and possess the legal capacity and authority to make the booking and accepts these booking conditions on behalf of everyone in their party.

You will be expected to pay a deposit at the time of booking of 30% of the charter cost. If we accept your booking, we will issue a Confirmation Invoice. A contract will exist between us from the date we issue the Confirmation Invoice or if you book within 7 days of departure the contract will exist when we accept your payment. When you receive the Confirmation Invoice please check the details carefully and inform us immediately if anything is incorrect.
